The Fiscal Office will be mailing out the 1099's for your 2014 tax returns on 1/23/2015. Please keep an eye out for them they are very important tax documents.

Tribal Members who receive Revenue Sharing Distributions on a Wells Fargo Pay Card. Wells Fargo has transitioned your Pay Cards to a new Prepaid Card. Those participating in Pay Cards should have received your new Wells Fargo Prepaid Card in the Mail. These cards were mailed out in December 2014 and January 2015. Please be sure you activate your prepaid card by February to receive your distribution in February. Tribal TANF of Sonoma County is a federally funded program created to give states the ability to give time-limited (60 Months) aid to needy families with children.



Water Quality

Contaminate Trends at the Stewarts Point Rancheria

Since 2008 the Tribe's Water Quality Monitoring Program has been sampling water quality in the springs, wells and rivers at or near the Rancheria to see what contaminants are in the water.



The 6 red pins indicate the 6 locations where the Tribe measures water quality.

The Graph shows Contaminate Trends from 2008 to 2014. The *Contaminate Trends* show the tendency for some contaminants to remain in some *Water Sources* for more than one year.

Possible Causes of Contaminant Trends

Although it is difficult to know for sure where the contamination is coming from, here are some common sources.

- **Barium**: naturally from erosion of rock or from waste from drilling and metal refineries
- **Aluminum**: naturally from erosion of rock, from particles in the air, herbicide, or weathered scrap metal
- **Nickel:** naturally from erosion of rock, from particles in the air, weathered scrap metal; or Nickel refining, production and use in household goods and jewelry

High School sports will require a 2.0 GPA or higher in academic course.

Sea Ranch Invites Tribal Members...

Sea Ranch is inviting Tribal Members to attend concerts of the Kronos Quartet (www.kronosquartet.org) at Sea Ranch at no cost. The concerts are being held to celebrate the 50th anniversary of Sea Ranch. The central purpose for the concerts is to build bridges between communities. The Sea Ranch has commissioned a piece that reflects the coastal home/environment by composer Aleksandra Vrebalov, which Ms. Vrebalov calls "The Sea Songs", which is a one hour program. The Kronos Quartet and Ms. Vrebalov have written the following statement regarding these concerts:

"There are very few places in the whole world where an entire community is dedicated to live, build, and interact with its surroundings in harmonious and responsible ways. Counterbalancing destructive tendencies of a century marked by two world wars and catastrophic environmental accidents. The Sea Ranch, soon celebrating its 50th birthday, is a unique, living, materialized vision of a balanced and peaceful world.
