BURN NOTIFICATION PERMITS



Just a reminder for everyone who burns brush in their yards that you need to obtain a burn permit before doing any burning. If you live on the Rancheria the Tribe requires you to have a burn permit on file. The Tribe utilizes the burn notification under the BIA Pacific Regional Office's Wildland Fire Prevention Plan for tribes without one in place. Make sure to review the permit to see what items are allowed to be burned.

The Tribal Member requesting the permit will be held responsible for following all rules and regulations associated with this permit and the Tribe's Solid Waste Ordinance #6. Violation of the rules and regulations will result in immediate cancellation of the permit.

Permits are free and available at the Teacherage.

JOB ANNOUNCEMENT

FIREPLACE SAFETY

This is the time of year when we fire up our woodstoves, and also the time of year when fires occur. Get your chimney cleaned annually. Make sure ashes are cold before disposing. Don't burn wood that has paint, chemicals such as creosote, pressure-treated wood or plywood in your stove or fireplace. Burning these can cause fires, create unhealthy air in your home, contribute to pollution in your community, and worsen asthma. Use only natural, dried woods or clean lumber scraps.



WATCH OUT FOR ICE!

This has been an unusually cold winter, and there is ice on roadways and sidewalks. Be especially careful on country roads, especially bridges, which can stay icy all day. Be careful walking on sidewalks; you can throw rock salt on

your sidewalks to keep them from being slippery.



This is the time that our Elders need extra help! Check in on the Elders in your area; ask if they need help with firewood, errands, or chores. It is especially difficult for Elders to get around safely in cold winter weather!



I am a graduate from Arizona State University with my B.S. in American Indian Studies and have resided in California for a little over four years now.

I come to the Kashia Band of Pomo Indians of the Stewarts Point Rancheria with several years of EPA experience in which I have had the opportunity to work for several different Tribes and Tribal organizations in Arizona and California. My background of environmental experience ranges from solid/hazardous waste management to recycling program development to emergency response and preparedness to water quality monitoring. I have always had a passion to protect Mother Earth and all her beings living on and within her. I am also an advocate and supporter of Indigenous Human Rights in which I have had opportunities to be a part of Indigenous Environmental Network youth trainings, Redefining Progress Internship as well as assisting in the creation of a youth led multicultural grassroots organization called Black Mesa Water Coalition.

I am very thankful for the opportunity to work here with the Kashia Department of Environmental Planning as well as looking forward to meeting you, the community members, and providing assistance in protecting the water quality for the reservation.



FISCAL NOTICE



Indian Gaming Revenue Sharing Trust Fund Distributions (Per Cap)

Starting with the May 2013 distribution, you will have a choice on how you would like to receive your distribution payments. Instead of waiting for your check in the mail, you will be able to receive your money as a **Direct Deposit** into your checking account.

If you do not have a checking account you can receive your money on a **Pay Card**. Your **Pay Card** will work just like a debit card with no fees if you withdraw your quarterly distribution in cash from any Wells Fargo bank. You can also use the Pay Card like a Credit Card for signature point of sale transactions with no fees.

You could also continue to receive your check in the mail, but with **Direct Deposit** or a **Pay Card** your money will be available for you sooner, with no worries about your check being lost in the mail.
